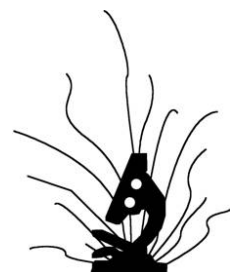
NutriCore NorthEast, Inc. Leaders Address National Economic Conference
